## NENA BOARD MEETING

- Brad Winter, Commander Remiker APD
  - Brad Winter and Commander Remiker were present to discuss the recent gun shots fired at random along Oakland
  - City Council passed a bill to build up the police department, but APD can't find qualified applicants
  - The City Council pilot program was passed. This program will hire 25 PSA's within 30 days. PSA's can be used for crime scene investigation.
  - There were concerns from neighbors regarding the use of Chief's overtime to patrol the neighborhood, concerns regarding how some officers have responded to people in the past, the lack of follow up when a report is filed.
  - Commander Remiker asked to be contacted when there are issues with officers
  - Gather information and call 242-COPS, 911, or 311 to file a report. Reports are reviewed and then linked together.
  - Property crime is a drug crime issue, typically occurring during the day.
  - Sharanne Press is the Crime Prevention Specialist for the NE Area Command. She is available to do a seminar or to come to homes to give tips on how to become a harder target.
  - Parks close at 10pm. Call APD if there are issues in the park after closing.
  - Camera trailers are only placed in public areas due to privacy concerns.
  - APD cannot see postings but can post on NextDoor.com

  - The neighbors along Oakland are looking into hiring private security and found it would cost around \$50 per hour. President Bob Smith offered NENA funds to help this neighborhood pay for private security if they decide to pool their resources and hire a company for a couple of weekends as we wait for the additional APD resources to become available for improved patrolling, crime response, and investigations
- Minutes from November's meeting were approved, motion by Jim, seconded by John
- Treasurer's Report
  - \$5,055.61 new balance
  - PO Box and District 4 Coalition dues were paid in January
  - 21 Paid up members
- Development Committee Report
  - Discussion regarding NENA boundaries, no clear boundaries
  - Jim and Bob met with the city regarding issues with zoning within NENA in the Integrated Development Ordinance (IDO). The issues were listened to and resolved.
  - In the IDO, areas will be rezoned to the least restrictive, but neighbors can petition to more restrictive

- On the map, NorEste 1 & 2 were changed from Mixed Use to Residential 1
- Publication Committee Report
  - Improve the website to get more traffic
  - Need more content
  - Email announcements to those registered to the site
  - Add the agenda for next month's meeting to the website prior to the meeting
  - Survey monkey link was sent with the newsletter in October. Only 4 responses.
  - Look at adding PayPal online for membership as a direct link from the website
  - Add articles that are unique to the area
  - Survey results top three concerns were accessibility, property crime, and drug concerns in the area
  - Need to review the by-laws this coming year
